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**All the Shadows of the Rainbow** - Inanna Arthen 2013-09-30

As a writer, I think part of my responsibility is to remind them of that. If you decide to read my story, just know that it's going to get really honest. It's going to get really messy, awkward, raw, and real. But real, that's what we want. Let's take off our masks, and together, learn what we have to offer this world. "Nineteen Eighty-Four: A Novel", often published as "1984", is a dystopian social science fiction novel by English novelist George Orwell. It was published on 8 June 1949 by Secker & Warburg as Orwell's ninth and final book completed in his lifetime. Thematically, "Nineteen Eighty-Four" centres on the consequences of totalitarianism, mass surveillance, and repressive regimentation of persons and behaviours within society. The protagonist, Winston Smith, is a diligent and skillful rank-and-file worker and Outer Party member who secretly hates the Party and dreams of rebellion. He enters into a forbidden relationship with a colleague, Julia, and starts to remember what life was like before the Party came to power.

**I'm Not with the Band** - Sylvia Patterson 2016-06-16
